PROCEEDINGS OF THE COMMISSION

Regular meeting of the Commission held via in person and Zoom videoconference on June 22, 2022.

Commission President Hasselblad called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

1) Public Hearing of the Facility Plan

N. Qualls hosted the Public Hearing for the Liquids Facility Plan. Public Comments were made by B. Lange in person, and F. Krumberger via Zoom.

2) Adopt Retirement Resolutions of Jeff Czypinski, IT Manager

Following closed session, agenda items were taken out of sequence based on staff's presence for reporting

Commissioner Hasselblad introduced J. Czypinski. Introductions were followed by career achievements by J. Czypinski, and B. Vander Loop expressed gratitude for his years of service at NEW Water.

6) Approval of minutes of Commission meeting held May 25, 2022.

It was moved by Meinz, seconded by Hoffman, and unanimously agreed to approve the May 25, 2022 meeting minutes as distributed.

7) Approve Resolutions for acceptance of the Compliance Maintenance Annual Report for 2021 for the Green Bay Facility

Commissioner Hasselblad went over the importance of the Compliance Maintenance Annual Report, and what the scores and report means for NEW Water. K. Verbeten started off by requesting that she be able to go over the Compliance Maintenance Annual Reports for both the Green Bay and De Pere Facility at the same time, and that they are approved in the same motion. Commissioners agree to allow one motion for both reports. K. Verbeten details the score NEW Water received for both facilities and requests the Commissioners approval of the resolutions.

Motion #22-042

It was moved by Meinz, seconded by Hoffman, and unanimously agreed to Approve Resolutions for acceptance of the Compliance Maintenance Annual Report for 2021 both the Green Bay and De Pere Facility (Resolution #22-005 and #22-006 are on file at the NEW Water offices)

8) Approve Resolutions for acceptance of the Compliance Maintenance Annual Report for 2021 for the De Pere Facility

This item was approved in the same motion as item seven with Commissioners approval.

9) May Financials

B. Clausen stated May, and year to date operating revenues were favorable to budget mainly due to BOD Loadings. May expenses were favorable for the month, and year to date. Power and plant maintenance were unfavorable to budget, and are anticipated to remain unfavorable for the year due to timing. We will see this be unfavorable for roughly \$80,000 by the end of the year. Contracted services are favorable due to timing.

10) Solids Management Plan Decision Recap

N. Qualls compiled information on why the R2E2 project was chosen, and the alternatives that were presented to the Commission at the time. Commissioners Hasselblad, Tumpach, Hoffman, and Meinz along with T. Sigmund discussed the financial analysis utilized and how the analysis differs from other approaches.

11) Update of Projects:

a) Green Bay Facility Pumping Station HVAC Rehabilitation

B. Brown stated that all equipment except the large wet well exhaust fan and associated drive unit has been installed. Supply chain issues are holding this project up, and additional construction costs could be incurred if equipment delivery is delayed beyond November.

b) Green Bay Facility Air Compressor Replacement

B. Brown stated that the Service Air system is functioning as designed and the Control Air system is running in a simplified temporary manual mode. Delivery of critical electrical components which will allow for project completion has now been delayed into August.

c) De Pere Facility Administration Building Renovation

B. Brown stated that asbestos remediation and demolition work have been completed. Wall framing and general construction are progressing on schedule.

d) DPF Tertiary Filtration and Service Water Improvements Project

B. Angoli stated that the programing that the manufacturer needed to make has been complete and the 7 day demonstration testing has been started on the half of the equipment that has been installed. If the system passes the 7 day demonstration testing contractor will be able to start demo work on remaining filters. Installation on the other half of the equipment is presently scheduled to be completed by end of August.

12) May 2022 Operations Report

P. Wescott provided an Operations Report. Both facilities were in full compliance with all effluent limits for the month of May. The Green Bay Facility was in compliance with air quality limits for the month of May. The solids processing facility generated 1,393 MWH of electricity. Bio-gas from the digestion process was utilized for the on-site electrical generation. Total bio-gas volume recovered was 218,400 CCF; this is 89.9% of the total volume produced. The E. coli limit has been inserted into the data reported each month for commission per permit requirements.

13) Executive Director's Report:

a) July Commission Meeting

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, July 20, 2022, at 8:30 a.m. which is a week earlier due to the NACWA conference. This meeting will be a hybrid meeting with in person attendance.
